

Transfer Sheet - Instructions

All patient moving and handling tasks should be carried out in accordance with approved patient moving and handling techniques and after a full assessment of patient, equipment, task and environment. Always follow the approved policy of your place of work when adopting moving and handling practices.

Description

The Locomotor Transfer Sheets are full body length washable transfer sheets incorporating handholds to enable sliding transfers. Typically used in combination with a bridging board, such as the Lateral Transfer Slide LOCO-119, for lateral transfers from bed to trolley etc.

Locomotor Transfer Sheets may also be used for floor transfers typically sliding a patient to a different location for physiotherapy mat work or evacuation.

Both the Transfer Sheet and the Deluxe Transfer Sheet have a 127kg weight limit for emergency vertical lifts where a hoist is either unavailable or inappropriate*.

Instructions for use

Lateral transfers incorporating a lateral transfer slide / board

Using an approved rolling technique position the transfer sheet centrally underneath the patient. Whilst the patient is being rolled onto the transfer sheet insert a lateral transfer slide underneath the transfer sheet in the correct position. Ideally with a third of the transfer slide's width under the patient and third of its width available for the destination surface.

Position the starting surface (e.g. bed) and destination surface (e.g. trolley) so that they are tightly aligned with minimal gap and with brakes applied to both surfaces. Have the starting surface slightly higher than the designation surface and then slide the patient to the destination surface using approved techniques and the required number of personnel.

Floor transfers

Having assessed it safe to move the patient, roll them onto the transfer slide using an approved rolling technique. Place a pillow or similar underneath the patient's head (on top of the transfer sheet). Using the required number of personnel, utilise the most appropriate handholds and slide the patient to the required destination.

Emergency lifts*

Roll the patient on to the transfer sheet and follow your manual handling protocol for emergency lifts ensuring you have the correct number of personnel and appropriate equipment to facilitate a vertical lift onto a horizontal surface (ideally a very low height adjustable trolley).



* This must be in accordance with your moving and handling policy, training and risk assessment. If emergency vertical lifts are not accommodated in your establishment, then do not perform.


